The Ability Experience raises funds through The Journey of Hope crosscountry bike rides to promote awareness of the capabilities and challenges of people with physical and intellectual disabilities.

The Journey of Hope is actually three 4,000 mile cross country cycling trips. 90 members from three different groups of Pi Kappa Phi chapters will travel from the west coast to Washington DC. Before beginning their journey, one group stopped at the AbilityFirst Long Beach Center where about 40 Ability Experience members joined children and adults with disabilities in a variety of activities including dancing, a photo booth, and relay races.

Locally, the Pi Kappa Phi chapter at CSULB has raised money and supported events at the Long Beach Center of AbilityFirst for several years. After visiting the AbilityFirst center, a group of 27



fraternity brothers and 9 trained crew members from various chapters kicked off their "Journey of Hope" to the nation's capital Friday, June 12, 2015 from the Pine Avenue Pier. Since the campaign's start 20 years ago, the organization has raised over \$15 million nationwide. Their mission is to build leaders of tomorrow by serving people with disabilities today.
