AbilityFirst Announces \$12 Million in grants funding from AS&F FoundationThe grant shall be used by AbilityFirst to establish and maintain an endowment for Camp Paivika

(PASADENA, CA) June 20, 2017 – AbilityFirst announces today a \$12 million gift from the AS&F Foundation to create an endowment for Camp Paivika, providing an all-accessible camp in the San Bernardino mountains and offering overnight summer programs for children and adults with disabilities. Camp Paivika gives campers the opportunity to have a traditional camp experience with nurturing support and an emphasis on having fun. It is one of the first fully accessible camps in the United States and has helped tens of thousands of children and adults with disabilities make friends, try new activities and become more confident and independent.

AbilityFirst will continue to offer residential camping opportunities to children and adults with disabilities and the Camp Paivika Endowment will be used primarily for the upkeep, care, maintenance and replacement, including capital projects at Camp Paivika.

This year marks the 70th anniversary of Camp Paivika. Programs throughout the summer allow children, teens and adults with disabilities the chance to enjoy well-regulated morning to night activities that are creatively adapted to enable fun and encourage participation. For 70 years, Camp Paivika has been guided by the principle, "can" and not, "cannot" – and no one is left out. Families and caretakers of campers are also given respite from the rigors and challenges of providing 24/7 care.
