ELA After-School Program

Each participant must complete an onsite intake and application process to meet licensing and Regional Center compliance. This process helps to ensure that our programs are an appropriate placement and can meet the individual's needs. The nature of our programs is to develop basic living skills, increase communication skills and increase social skills allowing individuals to be active participants in their community. This is done by each program participant working on goals developed specifically for them and identified on their Individual Service Plan.



After School and Summer Program

AbilityFirst after school and summer programs provide a nurturing environment for school age youth with developmental disabilities. Our well-trained and caring staff engages participants with age appropriate activities that support social, physical, cognitive, and creative abilities. Through center-based activities and field trips, AbilityFirst helps participants achieve their personal best. Hours of operation are from 2:00 pm to 6:00 pm when school is in session and 8:00 am to 6:00 pm during summer months and school breaks. Participants must be able to safely function in a 1:5 staffing ratio.

Program Supplemental Support 1:1 Ratio

Vendored Program – PE1710

Who: 5 - 22 years of age. Individuals with behavior challenges that need 1:1 support in order to fully and safely integrate in a 1:5 ratio social activity.

Recreation and Leisure Program

Vendored Program – PE1710

M-F after school until 6pm, currently during some school breaks and minimum days.

Who: 5-22 years of age. Participants 18 years and older must be enrolled in a special education high school program. Individuals may require up to 100% physical care including medication administration. Individuals with behavior challenges must fit into a 1:5 ratio and not be a threat to themselves or others.
